

**UCR offenses for the Month of August, 2016**


At the end of August, City-wide preliminary totals for Index Offenses decreased (- 4 %) compared to the first eight months of 2015. Violent crimes, i.e. Murder, Rape, Robbery, & Assault; decreased ( - 21 %), and Property crimes, i.e. Burglary, Larceny, Auto Larceny and Arson; decreased ( - 2 %) compared to the first eight months of 2015.

- Individual totals of the Violent Crimes categories for August of 2015 compared to August of 2016:
  - ⇒ Murders unchanged 0 to 0 ( **0 %**).
  - ⇒ Rapes increased 0 to 1 ( **100 %** ) .
  - ⇒ Robberies – overall robberies decreased 3 to 2 ( -33 %) with commercial robberies decreased 3 to 0 ( -100 %), and individual robberies increased, 0 to 2 ( **200 %**).
  - ⇒ The number of assaults increased from 4 to 5, ( **25 %**).
- Individual totals of the Property Crimes categories for August of 2015 compared to August of 2016:
  - ⇒ Overall Burglaries increased 23 to 24 ( **4 %**) with residential increased 10 to 21 ( **110 %**) with non-residential decreased from 5 to 0 ( -100 %) and commercial cases decreased 8 to 3 ( -63 %).
  - ⇒ Total larceny cases decreased from 83 to 77 ( -7 %).
  - ⇒ Reported auto theft increased from 2 to 6 ( **200 %**).
  - ⇒ Arsons unchanged from 0 to 0, ( **0 %** ) .

**UCR arrest offenses for the Month of August, 2016**

- Overall, for the eight months, Violent Crime arrests decreased ( -12 %) and Property Crime arrests decreased ( - 8 %).
- August 15 compared to August 16 saw Violent Crime arrests decreased from 9 to 7 ( -22 %) and Property Crime arrests decreased from 58 to 42 ( -28 %).
  - ⇒ Arrests for burglary increased 7 to 9 ( **29 %**); residential increased from 5 to 8 ( **60 %**).
  - ⇒ Arrests for larceny decreased from 51 to 33 ( -35 %).







### Departmental Update (s):

- The Transition Team has been meeting bi-weekly with the architect to review and provide suggestions on the design of the new PD.


# Heroin overdoses—2015 compared 2016
